Designations

- * Required prior to admission to the College of Business.
- Must pass the Basic Computer Skills Proficiency test or CIS 1026 (minimum grade of "C-") by the end of the sophomore year. We recommend that the test be taken during the freshman year so CIS 1026 can be taken during the sophomore year if the test is not passed.
- ENG 3100 or BE 3340 must be completed with a minimum grade of "C" prior to taking 4000-level business courses.
- One course must meet the Global Issues requirement (see Program of Study for options).

FA HS LS

- "COB Core Courses" include ENG 3100 or BE 3340, CIS 2050, ECO 2200, FIN 3680, MGT 3630, MKT 3050, and POM 3650.
- AGrad Audit is required prior to registering for MGT 4750 and BUS 4000. All COB Core Courses must be completed prior to taking MGT 4750 and BUS 4000. MGT 4750 and BUS 4000 are to be taken in the last semester or, for accounting majors planning an internship in the last semester, they must be taken in the last semester of course work that does not include the internship.
- Business majors must earn a minimum GPA of 2.0 in all business course work (prefixes ACC, BUS, CIS, ECO, FIN, HCM prior to fall 2010, HOS, LAW, MGT, MKT, POM, SCM).
- Business majors cannot take ACC 1050, FIN 3010 and MGT 3010 for credit towards any degree requirement.
- Accounting majors must earn a minimum GPA of 2.0 in the 27 hours of accounting courses required above ACC 2100 and ACC 2110.
- It is recommended that students try to carry only 13 hours during the first semester of the senior year (prior to the internship) because of "Meet the Firms" activities and, for some students, BETA ALPHA PSI activities.
- ^^Accounting majors who do not do the recommended accounting internship (ACC 3900) must, instead, complete the course
 work that the internship would have covered (typically, three hours of COB Elective and three hours of 3000/4000 level free
 electives). Students who complete a nine hour accounting internship, will typically fulfill the COB Elective (3000/4000 Level),
 the six hours of free electives that can be any level COB or Non-COB.
- One course must meet the Global Issues Requirement.
- Restrictions on 3000/4000 level business courses: Business majors can enroll in no more than five 3000/4000 level business courses prior to admission to the College of Business. A minimum GPA of 2.0 is required to take 3000/4000 level business courses if not admitted. Students must have 57 hours to take 3000 level business core courses, 60 hours to take all other

3000/4000 level business courses and 90 hours to take 4000 level business courses. A minimum grade of C in ENG 3100 or BE 3340 is required prior to taking any 4000 level business course.

• The following course work must be taken through ASU: the last 30 hours, 50% of all business course work required in the major, 9 hours of any minor. A minimum of 50 hours must be taken through a four year institution.
