You must also meet the Fine Arts, Literary Studies, Historical Studies, and the Social Science Designations. Those may be met within the Integrative Learning Experience and the Liberal Studies Experience.

Additional Notes:

- Only one 1000 level ANT course may count towards the major.
- Students may not enroll in a course as a CAPSTONE if they have already taken the parallel course.
- Summer Cultural Anthropology field schools offered through the department are also excellent options for elective courses, and may in some cases also substitute for ANT 3410.
- This major requires a multidisciplinary concentration, with courses taken across at least three different departments (including anthropology). The concentration courses must be approved by advisor and department chair.
- A contract with a list of the approved Concentration Area courses MUST be filed with the College Advising & Support Services Hub of the College of Arts & Sciences Dean's Office no later than the end of the first semester of junior year.
- Study abroad is strongly encouraged and the program of study outlined here can be adjusted to accommodate study abroad in any semester.
- Foreign Language is optional, but strongly recommended. Advanced courses may count towards concentration if advisor concurs.
- Minor is optional. Concentration credits may also count towards minor.
- Departmental Honors: any course may be contracted as an HONORS course if the instructor agrees and the course is suitable; HONORS research and thesis courses can fill the "open courses" at the Senior level.
- <u>Residency Requirements:</u>
 - o 31 hours must be from ASU
 - 18 hours in the major must be from ASU
 - 9 hours in the minor must be from ASU
 - Final 30 hours must be courses taken through ASU (includes internships, study abroad taken through ASU)
