## Additional Notes:

- Only one 1000 level ANT course may count towards the major, and would count as an elective.
- Students are advised to choose their required Cross Disciplinary work in consultation with an anthropology adviser.
- Study abroad is strongly encouraged and the program of study outlined here can be adjusted to accommodate study abroad in any semester.
- Summer Biological Anthropology field schools offered through the department or through other universities and programs are also excellent options for elective courses, and may in some cases also substitute for ANT 3300 or 3320 and possibly others with advanced approval.
- Departmental Honors: any course may be contracted as an HONORS course if the instructor agrees and the course is suitable; HONORS research and thesis courses can fill the "open courses" at the Senior level.
- Foreign language is not required for the B.S., but is highly recommended for all anthropology majors.
- Minor is optional, but quite feasible especially if the minor overlaps with cross disciplinary course work already undertaken.
- <u>Residency Requirements</u>:
  - o 31 hours must be from ASU
  - 18 hours in the major must be from ASU
  - 9 hours in the minor must be from ASU
