Additional Notes:

- This concentration will be discontinued by 2014-15, but students may still choose it now. However, as noted below, substitutions will be required that vary from current Bulletin, due to retirement of core professor. This concentration requires an Internship, usually carried out over a summer.
- No more than 46 hours in ANT may be counted towards the degree .
- Minor outside Anthropology required for this degree.
- Only one 1000 level ANT course may count towards the major, and would count as an elective.
- Internship (ANT 4900) is required and normally pursued in the summer between Junior and Senior year, or during Senior year.
- Summer Cultural Anthropology field schools offered through the department are also excellent options for elective courses, possibly for Internship credit, and may also substitute for ANT 3410.
- Departmental Honors: any course may be contracted as an HONORS course if the instructor agrees and the course is suitable; HONORS research and thesis courses can fill the "open courses" at the Senior level.
- Because this concentration will be discontinued in the near future, at least one course substitution (for the Applied Anthropology course) will be necessary. See Chair for details and options (including the option of switching to a new concentration to be launched 2014-15).
- Foreign language requirement:
 - Student must take the Foreign Language Placement Test to determine starting course for the foreign language sequence.
 - If Foreign Language 1010 & 1020 taken for prerequisite purposes, they will count in place of 6 hours of Free Electives (3 hours per course).
 - FL 1050 may be used in both major and Gen Ed requirements. If used to fulfill a Gen Ed Perspective theme course, replace one "Gen Ed Perspective" with Free Elective.
 - FL 1030 may substitute for FL 1010 & 1020 for some languages; FL 1060 may substitute for FL 1040 & 1050 for some languages.
 - Foreign Language courses can also be taken later in the course of study, but earlier is better.
 - Foreign language classes can be taken in summer semesters.
- <u>Residency Requirements</u>:
 - o 31 hours overall must be from ASU
 - o 18 hours in the major must be from ASU
 - 9 hours in the minor must be from ASU
