Additional Notes:

- ECO 2030, ECO 2040 and ECO 2100 can be taken during both summer semesters.
- No more than 46 hours in ECO may be counted towards the degree.
- Students must have 54 earned hours to take 3000 level ECO courses. Students must have 84 earned hours and a minimum grade of C in a WID course (such as ENG 3100 or BE 3340) to take 4000 level economics courses.
- Foreign language requirement:
 - Student must take the Foreign Language Placement Test to determine starting course for the foreign language sequence.
 - o If Foreign Language 1010 & 1020 taken for prerequisite purposes, they will count in the Free Elective area. If 1010 and/or 1020 are not needed, additional hours of Free Electives may be needed.
 - o FL 1050 covers a Gen Ed Liberal Studies Experience course.
 - FRE or SNH 1030 (6 sh) covers both FRE or SNH 1010 and 1020. FRE or SNH 1060 (6 sh) covers both FRE or SNH 1040 and 1050.

• Residency Requirements:

- o 31 hours overall must be from ASU
- 18 hours in the major must be from ASU
- 9 hours in the minor must be from ASU
