You must also meet the Fine Arts, Literary Studies, Historical Studies, and the Social Science Designations. Those may be met within the Integrative Learning Experience and the Liberal Studies Experience.

Additional Notes:

- *Required prior to admission to the College of Business.
- Must pass the Basic Computer Skills Proficiency test or CIS 1026 (minimum grade of "C-") by the end of the sophomore year. We recommend that the test be taken during the freshman year so CIS 1026 can be taken during the sophomore year if the test is not passed.
- One course must meet the Global Issues requirement (see Program of Study for options).
- Fulfill "Additional COB Core Course" placeholders with CIS 2050, MGT 3630, MKT 3050, and SCM 3650.
- ASenior Check is required prior to registering for MGT 4750 and BUS 4000. All other Additional COB Core Courses must be completed prior to taking MGT 4750 and BUS 4000. MGT 4750 and BUS 4000 are to be taken in the last semester.
- Business majors must earn a minimum GPA of 2.0 in the Additional COB Core courses.
- Business majors cannot take ACC 1050, FIN 3010 and MGT 3010 for credit towards any degree requirement.
- Risk Management and Insurance majors must earn a minimum GPA of 2.0 in the 21 hours of Risk Management and Insurance required courses and major electives.
- Restrictions on 3000/4000 level business courses: Business majors can enroll in no more than five business courses at the 3000 level or above, including graduate courses, prior to admission to the College of Business. Students must have 54 hours to take 3000 level business core courses, and 84 hours and a minimum grade of C in a WID course (such as ENG 3100 or BE 3340) prior to taking any 4000 level business course.
- The following course work must be taken through ASU: the last 30 hours, 50% of all business course work required in the major, 9 hours of any minor. A minimum of 50 hours must be taken through a four year institution.
