Additional Notes:

- At least 3 hours of 2000-level HIS is required prior to taking a 3000-level HIS course; at least 3 hours of 3000-level HIS courses is required prior to taking a 4000-level HIS course.
- No more than 15 hours (including HIS 2800) from the 2000 level may be used to fulfill Area III requirements.
- Students are co-admitted to Reich College of Education (RCOE) in order to complete education courses and student . teaching.
- A minimum 2.50 overall GPA is required for admission to RCOE and must be maintained through student teaching.
- Mixing History and Social Studies requirements early in the program is recommended in order to avoid having to take more than 3 History courses at the same time late in the program.
- Up to 6 semester hours of General Education courses may be double-counted in the major, depending on choices. Discuss with History Department advisor which courses satisfy this criterion.
- From their first semester, students interested in this major will be contacted by the program director with announcements of special meetings to give them information about program and the profession of teaching high school Social Studies.
- Reading, English, & Speech proficiencies required.
- Praxis II Area Exams are required for student teaching.
- **Residency Requirements:**
 - 31 hours must be from ASU
 - 18 hours in the major must be from ASU 0
 - 9 hours in the minor must be from ASU 0
