Additional Notes:

- At least 3 hours of 2000-level HIS is required prior to taking a 3000-level HIS course; at least 3 hours of 3000-level HIS courses is required prior to taking a 4000-level HIS course.
- No more than 15 hours (including HIS 2800) from the 2000 level may be used to fulfill Area III requirements.
- Mixing History and other requirements early in the program is recommended in order to avoid having to take more than 3 History courses at the same time late in the program.
- Up to 6 semester hours of General Education courses may be double-counted in the major, depending on choices. Discuss with History Department advisor which courses satisfy this criterion.
