- Admission to this online program is required and is designed for the student who has earned an Associate in Applied Science degree in Nursing, or an Associate Degree in Nursing, or a Diploma in Nursing from a hospital program, and holds a RN license to practice nursing in North Carolina or a compact state. - 18 s.h. in major and 9 s.h. in minor must be at ASU.
- 50 s.h. must be earned from a Senior Institution and 25% of the degree hours must be in residency at ASU, with the final 30 s.h. in residence.
- A minimum grade of "C" or higher in each Nursing course is required before proceeding to the next course; however, an overall GPA of 2.50 is required in the Nursing courses at the end of the second semester to progress in the program.
