- Refer to the Major POS and the General Education POS for more information and pre/co-requisites.
- Praxis I requirement should be met during the FRESHMAN YEAR.
- Apply to teacher education during sophomore year.
- ALL non-block coursework should be completed before 6th semester.
- Try to use electives and General Education courses toward CONTENT AREA to be "highly qualified" for licensure.
- Students completing both Adapted Curriculum and General Curriculum should take SPE 4497 Practicum III (3 sh) as one of their electives.
- A student must have at least a 2.70 grade-point average to be admitted to the teacher education program and must maintain a 2.70 grade-point average overall through student teaching.
