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



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

You must also meet the Fine Arts, Literary Studies, Historical Studies, and the Social Science Designations. Those may be met within the Integrative Learning Experience and the Liberal Studies Experience.

Additional Notes:

- Many cognate courses can count toward General Education but not all will due to placement in themes. See your academic advisor if you have questions.
- Social work majors must earn a C or better in all required cognate and pre-requisite courses. Social work majors must complete the foundation courses (SW 2010, SW 2020, SW 2615, SW 2630, and SW 3000) with a C or better and be accepted into the Professional Sequence in order to move on to Professional Sequence courses (SW 3330, SW 3850, SW 3870, SW 4000, SW 4010, SW 4020, SW 4650, SW 4690, SW electives). Social work majors must complete the Professional Sequence courses with a C or better to move onto Field. Social work majors must complete Field Seminar with a C or better and receive as "Satisfactory" grade in Field Placement in order to graduate. - 18 s.h. in major and 9 s.h. in minor must be at ASU.





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- 50 s.h. must be earned from a Senior Institution and 25% of the degree hours must be in residency at ASU, with the final 30 s.h. in residence.
- Students participating in University Honors and/or Departmental Honors will have additional requirement; all must be met prior to Field semester when students are enrolled in SW 4650 and SW 4690.
- As stated in the catalog, the final responsibility for meeting graduation requirements remains with the student.
